Exploring Monet's Garden: Art and Word Games

(Grades K–3; 45–60 minutes)

This interactive session offers a variety of flexible discussion, writing, movement, and art-making activities inspired by masterpieces by the Impressionist painter Claude Monet. The culminating art-making activity invites students to layer their responses to Monet's scenes of his garden at Giverny with their own creative interpretations.

(English Language Arts and Reading TEKS §110; Fine Arts TEKS §117)

Adventures with Wari Man: Art and Culture from Ancient Peru

(Grades K–3; 45–60 minutes)

Students will learn about the art and culture of the ancient Wari empire through group discussions and literacy-building activities that highlight natural resources from different regions of South America, with Spanish and English vocabulary.

(English Language Arts and Reading TEKS §110; Fine Arts TEKS §117)

Reading into Art: Highlights from the Kimbell Collection

(Grades K–12; 45–60 minutes)

Interactive discussions focusing on some of the Kimbell's best-known artworks will incorporate selected Fine Arts, English Language Arts, and Social Studies learning components adaptable to all grade levels. Museum educators collaborate with teachers to select from among various topics for discussion and studio activities; sessions would also be an excellent way to help prepare for museum visits.

(English Language Arts and Reading TEKS §110; Social Studies TEKS §113, specifically Geography, Economics, Culture; Fine Arts TEKS §117)

Working in the Museum: Professional Skills and Experiences

(Grades 7–8; grades 11–12; 45–60 minutes)

The staff-facilitated program will feature video interviews and discussion prompts to highlight different areas of responsibility in the museum, with related skills, interests, and career paths.

(Career Development TEKS §127.2 and §127.11)

- Limited offer for the 2019–2020 school year; available on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Submit your online request for a classroom visit at least 4 weeks prior to your preferred dates.
- Programs are intended for individual classrooms of no more than 30 students. In order to accommodate groups of more than 30 students, schools may schedule multiple classroom visits over the course of a day. For groups of more than 100, visits may be scheduled over a series of days.
